The Question of the Week

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, (the disciples) were all in one place together.

Suddenly there came from the sky a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were.

Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire which parted and came to rest on each of them.

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

Acts 2: 1-3

The very Spirit of God would now enter into each of them and abide within them. That very Spirit would indwell their souls from that day forward. And from that moment when they opened themselves to the Spirit they were never the same. Why? Because up until then they had the Holy Spirit. NOW the Holy Spirit had them! My friends, that is what we really want. We want the Holy Spirit to be in charge in our lives, directing, guiding, enlightening, strengthening, and leading us. Pray for that grace for yourselves each day. It made all the difference in the lives of those early disciples. Wouldn't you like to be free from the fears that so often assault you from within and without? That is the question of the week.
