If we do not live kingdom virtues here on earth, why would we think that we will even want to go to "heaven" if we do not live, love and enjoy those virtues here?

Do I think that entering heaven is something that I personally do? Or is there something that Jesus Christ has to do to allow me to enter? Have I been washed clean? In what way? In the blood of the Lamb? How can I be washed clean—in blood. The Blood of Christ is different. The Blood of Christ alone has conquered sin and conquered death. The Blood of Christ is a sign of his love. Have I allowed his love to cleanse me? Have I accepted the cross in my life from whence his blood did flow? Or have I ignored Him?
