I never knew that. The couple's names were Gloria Shayne and Noel Regney. The key phrase come towards the end: Pray for peace, people everywhere. It was a plea to pray to the Prince of Peace to bestow his peace on this world that was on the brink of a great catastrophe. And people did pray. And the crisis was averted.

Pope Francis has joined with all the Bishops of the World and all the priests and all the believers in dedicating and consecrating the countries of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Our Lady, Queen of Peace. This is not the time to stop our praying for peace to break out in those countries. The enemy has been defeated. We are to send him and his fallen accomplices to the foot of the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the site of their greatest defeat. There shall not be victory pf evil ever again. Whether we sing or whether we pray. Let peace be in our hearts—even in the middle of the summer.
