Most of all, Ellen is a friend. She has had her tragic moments when she lost her husband Tom who also worked here doing the financials for a number of years after he retired from the Navy Yard. Ellen was able to interact with all members of the staff with ease and comfortability. Just that is a lot because there are many people interacting on a daily basis.

We had a luncheon for her last week and gave her some gifts and cards and little surprises. Thank God we will continue to see her in church because Saint Anthony's has been a large portion of her life for many years. I personally will miss her and in my card I said that I was proud of her for the way she did what she did all these years. Say some prayers in thanksgiving for a job well done.

Because Ellen was leaving, we advertised and interviewed for a person to replace her at the from office desk. Our new parish secretary is also a parishioner.
